

In Year 1 our focus for Global Values Day was Kenya.

We searched for Kenya on Google Earth/world map and compared it to the UK. We watched videos, read books about the life of a child and their routine, and compared it to ours (morning routine/breakfast/prayers/walk to school/local area/school day /uniform /jobs /family life - dancing).

We listened to African music and created African patterns in art. We also read stories. We had various photographs and sorted them into either taken in the UK or in Kenya. We also made a list of comparisons and coloured in the Kenyan flag.



Year 2 explored the life of Amazing Grace and other African tales.



Year 5 did some lovely work in their books – we used the Christian Aid and looked at where Christian Aid helps around the world. We then focused on South America, as that is our topic. Children created a tree with reasons for Christian Aid, how it started – linked to Bible story – added values onto the tree that they show. They then watched 2 video clips of different children in South America and how their lives have been turned around because of help they have received and the values that were also shown. They created two postcards as if they were the people from the videos. Children then came up with own ideas of how they can help others or raise money; they want to put on an afternoon tea some point at the end of the half term!
